



## INSTALLING A DOG CABLE RUN

A cable run is easy to install. The dog's lead, which should be made of vinyl coated wire or chain, is attached to a pulley that glides over a long piece of vinyl-coated wire rope/cable. The wire rope is then fastened between two posts, two walls, or a wall and a post. The pulley slides along the wire rope, according to the progress of the dog, thereby providing considerable exercise while still keeping the dog under control and safe. A 3.2mm vinyl coated wire is generally strong enough to secure a 70 kilogram dog.



If the wire is suspended from a pole (or poles), then a "stop" before the pole will be required to prevent the lead from getting wrapped around the pole. The stop is simply a cable clamp that will stop the pulley from passing. It is secured on the running wire at a distance away from the pole that prevents the dog's lead from wrapping around the pole. If the end of the wire is attached to a building, then a "stop" is not necessary.



Please note that the use of a running wire is only recommended when there is no fenced yard, and a pen is not an option.

A dog should not be left on a running wire longer than four hours at a time, with one to two hours of absolute freedom given to the dog once off the running wire.

Running wire kit, also known as "Tie Out Cable Trolley" kits can be purchased at various pet outlets or online. An example is pictured to the right.
